-SUMMARY POINT-

The "set theory" is how you treat the person of Christ in your community. Is He bounded in your community through "fences" or boundaries? Is He accentuated as the central focal point of your community? Is He thought of as a participant in the community? Is He in the soul of humankind within the community? These questions and the implication of them must be answered, for where Christ resides result in a certain culture of missionality in the community.

The goal is to discover Christ and multiply that discovery in others.

The Priority of Relationship

Start with five

A church designer must understand the priority of relationship. Their role and value must be understood in order to paint the priority of relationship in the culture. Are you committed to intentionality in relationships? Right now you may be just starting out in the design process or currently contextualizing the faith community to your area. It is time to commit to intentional relationships and making them a priority. Write down under each enso five couple units or singles that do not know Jesus or are disconnected from His church. Beginning the process of intentionally pursuing each person spiritually. Each week you will do something for them or on behalf of them. Pray for them, bring them a gift, visit with them over coffee, or visit them at their home or work if allowed. Begin to talk about the stories of intersection with these people and how God is drawing them to His community. Pray each week that they would be involved and join the community. Continue to use this exercise to connect people to God and others.
